



How is our Property Tax Money spent?



Village Tax Bill

- Dans Village Ops = Village operating money
- Municipal Stst = Village of Dansville Street Fund (paving etc.)
- 1% Admin = The Village keeps to use for the purpose of assessing and collecting property taxes.

Township Summer Bill

- SET = State Education Tax
- Ingham Co Tax = Ingham County operating
- 1% Admin = The township keeps to use for the purpose of assessing and collecting property taxes.

Township Winter Bill

- Sch Op = Dansville School district operating money
- Ingham ISD = This money goes to the Ingham Intermediate School District which our school is part of and utilizes their services
- Dist Library = This is used for all of the District Library's in Ingham County which we have one downtown Dansville
- Dans Sch Debt = This is for Dansville Schools' 1994 improvement loan which was used to improve the buildings. This was refinanced in 1998 and 2008 to reduce the interest rate.
- Dans Sch Sinking = This is for Dansville Schools to maintain existing grounds and buildings and for existing structural improvements
- Ingham Township = This is for the Township operating.
- LCC = Lansing Community College which since you pay this tax the tuition rate is considered "in District" and is a lower rate.
- Fire Dept. = This is for the operation of our Fire Department. Since you pay this tax you would not be charged for a fire or medical response (the ambulance service is not part of Ingham Township and would charge for transportation)
- Ingham County = This is for Ingham County to use for the following: Spec. Transportation, Public Transportation, 911 System, Health Services, Parks/Trails, Airport Authority, Juvenile Justice, Potter Park, Farmland act.
- Drain Assmt = The Ingham County Drain Commissioner assess's special assessments on properties whom are affected by a drain improvement. You would get notification from the Drain Commissioners Office sometime during the Summer.
- 1% Admin = The township keeps to use for the purpose of assessing and collecting property taxes.
